Police Department temporarily relocates to 355 Main Street, downtown Platte City

The Police Department has temporarily moved out of the east wing of the Civic Center due to structural problems in the building found during a floor replacement project and higher than allowable radon levels in the east wing crawl space.

The Police Department move to 355 Main Street (downtown, across the street from City Hall) is expected to occur the week of May 1st. There is no time line for returning to the east wing of the Civic Center pending a review of the extent and costs involved in fixing the building structural and environmental issues. However, it is expected the department will be in its new location for a minimum of one year.

The original floor repair project was to remove and replace floor sheeting in the squad bay portion of the building while also conducting spot repairs of the floor structural components.

As the floor sheeting was removed to gain access to the crawl space, it became obvious that virtually all of the beams, joists and stringers supporting the east wing floor had failed or were in danger of failing.

In addition, air quality testing in the crawl space showed significant mold and elevated radon levels.

The City decided to move the Police Dept, until it is able to determine the full cost to repair the floor, remove the mold, mitigate the radon and add a crawl space ventilation system. Once those costs are known, the City can determine whether it is a good value to repair the existing building or consider a different permanent replacement.

Radon levels in the municipal courtroom and the west wing of the building (gym, cafeteria and Parks Department) were below the level needed for any action.

MUNICIPAL COURT LOCATION UNCHANGED

Platte City Municipal Court will remain in the Central Wing of the Civic Center, 900 Fourth Street.

The Central Wing of the building, where the courtroom is located, does not share a crawl space or floor system with the Police Department. Courtroom radon testing was below the regulatory limit.

This fall, the City will replace the 18 gallon green recycling bins with the larger 95 gallon wheeled bin shown at right. This change will occur with no additional charge to ratepayer.

In addition to the materials we currently take – aluminum cans, 1-7 plastics, tin cans, paper (including newspaper, magazines, office paper, advertising inserts, envelopes); we will also begin accepting cardboard and paperboard. This will include things such as cereal boxes, paper boxes, corrugated boxes, drink cartons, moving boxes, etc.

Glass will no longer be accepted; however glass can be dropped off at our recycle center at 108 Paxton, or at the Ripple Glass container in the parking lot at Price Chopper.

The new carts are expected in later summer. More information will be sent monthly.
