Caution...Road Construction Ahead



Highway 92/Kentucky project: Beginning May 16th, Highway 92 from I-29 to Kentucky Ave will be reduced to one-lane each way. MoDOT expects Hwy 92 will resume two-lane each way traffic when the reconstruction project is completed this fall. Additional traffic notices will be released for each phase of this project. This project will extend Kentucky Avenue north through the QuikTrip/McDonald's area.

Kentucky Ave: The extension of Kentucky Avenue from Bent Oak to Fourth Street is on schedule for a late-August completion.

Leash Up – The City requires all pets to be on a leash to protect you, your pet and others. A leash will keep you in control during the walk and ensure that your pet does not slip away.

Clean Up – It is your responsibility to clean up after your pet. The City requires clean up in all areas, especially in parks and around trails and sidewalks. Keep the peace by not leaving a mess.
